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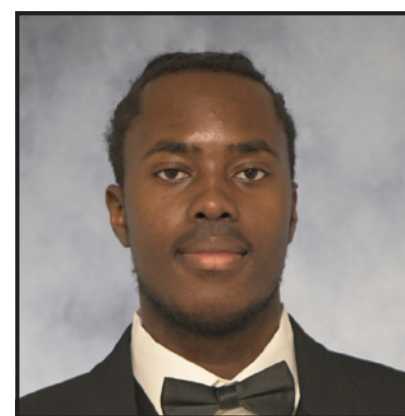
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Social Lites, Inc. Hosts 58th Annual Beautillion Scholarship Program: *"Mastering Your Destiny, Defines Your Success"*

Meet La Sierra University's First Black President Dr. Christon Arthur

about her childhood and how she was kicked out of school in third grade. Not because she was a bad child or not intelligent, but because she was a girl and her school thought she should be at home and domesticated.

Arthur was very close to his late mother, whom he called his inspiration for pursuing the field of education. From a young age Arthur was determined to become a teacher so that what happened to his

mother would never happen to anyone again.

Since July 1, 2024, Arthur has served as La Sierra University's sixth president. He is the university's first Black president since the school was founded in 1922. La Sierra University is a private, Seventh-day Adventist university. Prior to his appointment at La Sierra, Arthur was the provost of Andrews University in Michigan.

"Being the first anything

could be daunting, could be challenging, but at the same time, it's an opportunity," Arthur said.

"This is Southern California. One of the more progressive parts of the country. La Sierra, is one of the more progressive universities within the private sector, and then it took us 103 years? You see it as an opportunity to be able to do good work, and to say, you give us
